**FULL ROAD CLOSURE IN MIAMI TOWNSHIP WILL BEGIN TOMORROW**  
***A portion of Branch Hill Guinea Pike will be closed in both directions***  
***beginning Wednesday, July 9, through Friday, August 8***

Batavia, OH – The Clermont County Engineer's Office today announced that traffic on Branch Hill Guinea Pike from Glen Echo Lane to State Route 28 will be closed in both directions beginning Wednesday, July 9, through Friday, August 8, 2014, weather permitting. A detour will be in place that directs traffic from Branch Hill Guinea Pike to SR 28 to Business 28 to Cook Road.

The work in this area is part of a coordinated regional plan to address travel needs for a large number of residential homeowners, as well as business and retail properties. The project is scheduled to be completed this fall and will feature wider travel lanes, a new center turn lane and improved pedestrian access with a sidewalk along the east side of the road.

"This new closure is a sign that we're moving closer to the completion of the Branch Hill Guinea Improvements Project," said Clermont County Engineer Pat Manger. "We are making significant progress in this area and the Branch Hill Guinea project is part of a series of local network improvements that will ease congestion, improve safety, as well as increase access to business and shopping in the Clermont County area. We appreciate drivers' patience as they travel through various work zones, and remind them to slow down and use caution in these areas."

*The Clermont County Transportation Improvement District (CCTID) works across geographic and political lines to improve the quality of life for Clermont County residents by stimulating economic development through regional transportation improvements.
