I-275/SR 32 Construction Update; Various Access Points Along SR 32 Closing Permanently

The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) announced that yesterday, Monday, July 28, the existing ramp from eastbound SR 32 to Eastgate Blvd. was closed and the new ramp, which goes over the top of the new tunnel structure and is located to the west of Eastgate Blvd., has opened in its place.

Also, access to eastbound SR 32 from Eastgate Blvd. is now closed for 120 days for construction of a new ramp. Traffic is being detoured to Eastgate North Dr. to Glen Este Withamsville. The new ramp is expected to open to traffic before Thanksgiving, weather permitting.

Due to this work, the permanent closure of Eastgate Square is required near the McDonalds at SR 32. Beginning today, Tuesday, July 29, motorists will no longer have access to SR 32 at Eastgate Square. This access will not reopen.

Arrow boards and/or signs are in place to alert motorists of the upcoming work zone and restrictions.

To help ensure the safety of the construction workers as well as the traveling public, motorists should remain alert, reduce their speed and watch for stopped traffic while passing through the work zone.

Two Major Projects are Nearing Completion

Work to improve the interchange at I-275 & SR 125 is nearing completion. Daytime work is scheduled to be completed by the end of this week, weather permitting. Once daytime work has concluded, pavement repair will begin at night, and the entire project is scheduled to be completed in August. These improvements will

increase capacity and ease congestion on SR 125 (also known as Beechmont Ave.).

In addition to this work, the reconstruction of Eastgate Blvd. over SR 32 is also scheduled to be completed in August. This project includes the reconstruction and widening of the Eastgate Blvd. bridge over SR 32, the relocation of the existing Westbound entrance and exit ramps from SR 32 to Eastgate North Dr. instead of Eastgate Blvd., and the reconstruction of the Westbound loop ramp from Eastgate Blvd. to SR 32. The local project team expects that this work will significantly improve traffic flow and access to various destinations along Eastgate Blvd.
